

Maritime Zone	Area	Jurisdiction
Internal Waters	All waters landward of the baseline	A State has sovereignty over these waters
Territorial Sea	From the baseline to a maximum of 12 nautical miles	A State has sovereignty over the airspace, water, seafloor and subsoil in this zone
Contiguous Zone	From the end of the territorial sea to a maximum of 24 nautical miles	A State can enforce laws regarding pollution, customs, immigration and taxation in this zone
Exclusive Economic Zone	From the end of the territorial sea to a maximum of 200 nautical miles	A State has sovereignty over the exploration, exploitation, management and conservation of resources in the water, on the seabed and under the seafloor, and has jurisdiction over protecting the marine environment
High Seas	Beyond the exclusive economic zone	No State has sovereignty over the high seas

UNCLOS defines jurisdiction via maritime zones to include the definitions above.
